
This sentence by C. S. Lewis expresses the essence of our LIME project which sees the collaboration of a varied group of motivated and experienced Italian and Spanish partners.

Intoduction about the LIME project and the MEIC methodology

The successful integration of young third country nationals (TCNs) into the labour market is not just a challenge, but also a great opportunity. This is the vision carried out by the LIME project – "Labour Integration for Migrants Employment" which aims to promote the swift integration of young third country nationals (TCNs) - between the age of 18 to 29 years old - into the labour market. This 2-years project started in December 2018 and funded by the DG Home Affairs - Asylum, Migration and Integration fund of the European Union gathers 7 partners from Italy, Spain and France

In order to improve the migrants' labour inclusion, the LIME project is willing to implement all over Europe an innovative and high participatory methodology: the MEIC - Migrants Economic Integration Cluster methodology, an innovative and participatory approach based on the creation of a partnership of socioeconomic multi-stakeholders, including public and private actors.

The core of the project is the 2 pilot actions implemented in Rome and Madrid, under which the MEIC methodology has been developed and tested. These two pilot projects involved around 100 young third country nationals (TCNs) through several courses (language courses, cooking classes, business training, etc.). The LIME project also aims to mobilize key actors in terms of migrants' labour inclusion to apply the MEIC model all over Europe, and thereby organized several workshops and webinars in order to raise awareness among stakeholders and institutions on this topic.






































































































Results of the project

During its two years of implementation, the LIME project has produced very good results, especially in the two pilot actions in Spain and in Italy.

In Madrid, Total participants 49 young adult asylum seekers took part in the pilot project and participated in various activities and courses such as Spanish courses, soft skills training, kitchen training, mentoring sessions, job orientation. During the project: 49 people were trained in the catering sector, 10 participants were involved in the training on the job, 7 ended the project with job contract after the training and 14 beneficiaries have found a job without the training on the job.

As for Rome, the beneficiaries could also have access to numerous vocational training courses: catering, automotive and electrical courses, soft skills assessment activities, selfentrepreneurship training, coaching courses, and professional Italian courses. Thanks to this project, 12 people were afterwards involved in on-the-job training, 1 was involved in the national civil service and 11 participants even found a job! The pilot action also made possible the creation of 2 business plans as well as a new start up. Through this comic book and Kala's story, we have tried to give a voice to all the people we have met during the two years of the project. We wish them the best of luck.
